Teacher careers in the new age

Teaching is one of the most important professions in our society. Yet, over the last 40 years, teacher shortages and high attrition rates have constituted serious challenges in many education systems.

Teacher and school leader careers are commonly criticised for being flat and not offering individuals proper professional development opportunities. Following the examples of educational systems like those of Singapore and Japan, "second-generation" teaching careers represent a possible solution to centre career ladders on the evidence of professional development and expertise.



The latest overview of EU-funded projects puts the spotlight on three remarkable initiatives that promote some important changes to the teaching profession. Several factors have contributed to systematically diminishing the status and attractiveness of this profession. For this reason, understanding the different challenges and preparing for the future can help to create a "stronger and more attractive" teaching profession.




TEACHER CAREERS IN THE NEW AGE

European Toolkit for Schools accrues new tools

The Toolkit, with a database of over 150 resources, most of them summarised in 23 languages, helps school leaders, teachers, parents and many others to make education more inclusive, thereby preventing early school leaving.



This month it expanded its offering with a new self-assessment tool and video section. The new tool on inclusion helps users to reflect on their school's policies and practices and discover ways to improve them. It is based on the NESET report Structural Indicators for inclusive systems in and around schools and was developed with primary and secondary schools in mind.



Like the report, the self-assessment tool is divided into seven sections, each covering a set of questions. After answering these questions, the users will get a personalised report indicating where they do well and in which areas there is room for development.

In addition, a new video section now includes reports of good practices in the field of inclusive education and tackling early school leaving.
